### Membership

In 2023, Local Cloth welcomed 189 new and renewed members, ending the year with 443 active members, which is 105 more members than this time last year!

#### **Local Cloth Retail Shop**

In 2023, 13 new vendors joined the Local Cloth Retail Shop, bringing the total to 59 fiber artists and farmers. The Retail Shop also ended the year with \$127,170 in sales. This reflects an increase of more than \$38,000 from last year! The Retail Shop represents multiple types of fiber materials and arts, including weaving, knitting, felting, crochet, eco-printing, paper, books, sewing, marbling, batik, quilting, garden products, roving and spun yarn.

### Workshops + Interest Groups

Celebrating the third year in the Local Cloth Depot Street Studio, Local Cloth hosted 89 workshops, serving 631 individuals. In addition, 103 interest group meetings were held, including the launch of two Mending Matters Interest Groups, Blue Ridge Blanket Project Skirting Teams, and the return of the Textile Study Group.

An educational member of SHCG, hosted vendor and info booth featuring 9 fiber artists. Launched 2023 Limited Edition Blue Ridge Blankets. Led by Joan Berner and Judi Jetson.

Hosted an information booth, spotlighting workshops and the Holiday Market, and make-and-take table. Led by Judi Jetson + Rose Brinkmann.

# Blue Ridge Blanket (BRB) Project

In October 2023 following two years of work, Local Cloth launched the sale of the 2023 Limited Edition Blue Ridge Blankets online, in the Local Cloth Retail Shop, and at the Grovewood Gallery. One of our most ambitious ventures to date, the mission of the Blue Ridge Blankets project is to help revitalize the fiber economy in western North Carolina by connecting fiber farmers, processors, dyers, and weavers together to produce locally sourced and crafted blankets. Wool, mohair, and alpaca were sourced from 15 different farms in the region, and then handpicked, spun into yarn, hand-dyed with natural, heritage colors (indigo, madder root, walnut, weld) and woven into 19 different designs. Based upon votes from around the region, five designs were selected for the 1st edition: Asheville, Barnardsville, Black Mountain, French Broad River, and Pisgah. We identified two major gaps in our region's supply chain: the lack of a mid-sized spinning mill and the need for a loom room (a place where weavers can store and work on production-sized looms). The Blue Ridge Blanket Project is intended to be ongoing, with proceeds from each year's sales supporting the purchase of wool, alpaca, and mohair to make the following year's blankets. We believe this small attempt to reconnect the parts of the supply chain will improve the income of our region's farmers and weavers. We are pleased that our project was featured in the Winter 2023 edition of Carolina Home + Garden Magazine and the January 2024 Our State Magazine.
